



Nonprofits embrace technology as a mission-critical tool

How nonprofit organizations are using technology to streamline their operations, optimize processes and focus on their missions

As organizations across all industry sectors infuse more technology into their operations and achieve their digital goals, nonprofits are getting in on the trend.

Spanning small private foundations to large public charities—and all points in between—nonprofit organizations play an important role in our economy, society and lives. There are just over 1.5 million nonprofit organizations operating in the U.S., where those groups contributed \$1.4 trillion to the national economy in 2022.

Historically, nonprofit organizations have lagged behind for-profit businesses when it comes to digital transformation, but that's slowly changing. Where lack of funding has interfered with some groups' ability to invest in and implement new technologies, for example, many of those solutions have since become more affordable and accessible to a wider swath of organizations.

This "democratization of technology" has allowed more nonprofits to get the solutions, software and hardware they need to be able to work better, smarter and more efficiently in the modern business environment. However, many nonprofit organizations continue to operate the same way—year after year or even decade after decade—when more effective and inexpensive options can be implemented.

"The mission may not have changed, but the optimal way of conducting business certainly has," RSM US LLP observed in an article identifying 5 signs your nonprofit needs to update its business processes. "Modernizing has never been more crucial for mission-driven organizations. Inefficient procedures can bust budgets, create internal turmoil and limit the ability to achieve mission objectives. In contrast, improving your nonprofit's operational efficiency can greatly increase your organization's impact."





Embracing tech as a mission-critical tool

Many social service organizations, community-based organizations, charitable organizations and global nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) rely heavily on manual processes to run their operations. From grant management to donor reporting to volunteer coordination, much of the work is done on disconnected systems. Sharing data across these systems is a manual-intensive, error-prone process that consumes valuable resources that the average nonprofit organization can't spare.

"These organizations generally have small teams, limited resources and very important missions to accomplish," said Bharat Chandu, a technology consulting director at RSM. Most nonprofits are also struggling with broader issues like poor employee retention and back-office efficiency. Most want to improve the effectiveness of their fundraising, get better visibility into the impact of their programs and be able to link funding to specific positive impacts. Finally, they need to produce accurate reports for donors; accurately track expenses and resources; and run organizations where long-term financial success is backed by a strong workforce.

Achieving these goals isn't easy for nonprofits and charities that rely on legacy enterprise resource planning (ERP) platforms that were not built to manage the modern organization. Other groups use on-premises ERPs that require on-site access and don't support their increasingly remote work culture. In many cases, on-premises software can't adapt to changing business trends/regulations; has limited integration/automation/customization capabilities; and is difficult to train new users on. "With a lack of up-to-date technology," Chandu said, "nonprofits often also lack access to accurate real-time reporting, business intelligence tools and access to regular system upgrades."
